It was in Ronkonkoma, New York where Liz grew up, graduated high school, and fell in love with her teenage sweetheart, George Watkins. Once WWII began, George went away to serve in the Army and Liz started commuting to work in Bethpage, New York. There she worked in an office at the Grumman Aircraft Engineering Corporation, the leading U.S. producer of military and civilian aircraft in the 20th century.

When George returned from war, he and Liz married when she was 23 years old. Together they made plans for Liz to continue work and for George to receive a college education.
